

Resource Pack for implementing Fuller recommendations for babies, Children and Young people across London's ICBs

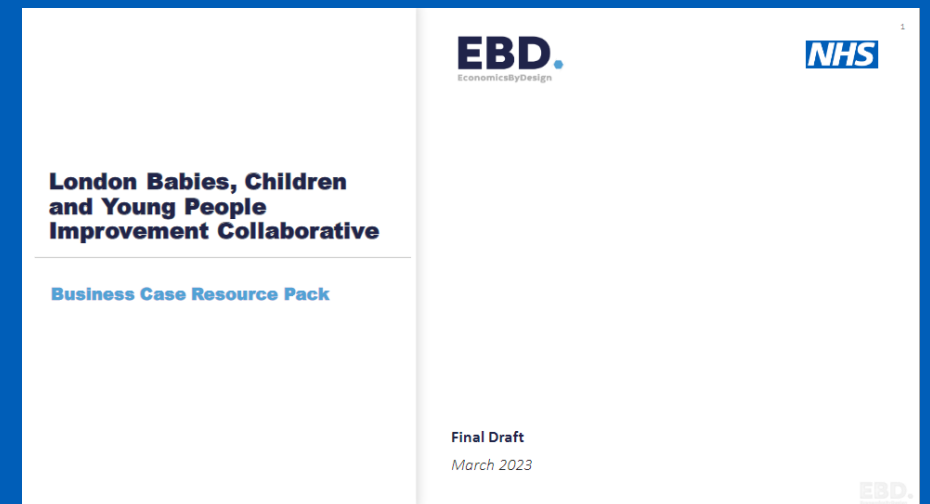
This resource Pack has been designed to support ICBs through the scoping and implementation of new integrated service models for London's babies, children and young people.

- providing more proactive, personalised care with support from a multidisciplinary team of professionals to people with more complex needs, including, but not limited to, those with multiple long-term conditions*
- helping people to stay well for longer as part of a more ambitious and joined-up approach to prevention.”*
