

Resource Pack for implementing Fuller recommendations for babies, Children and Young people across London's ICBs

This <u>resource Pack</u> has been designed to support ICBs through the scoping and implementation of new integrated service models for London's babies, children and young people.

It is designed around each of the main components of business case planning including strategic and economic considerations and can be adapted according to each ICSs templates and process for business case submission.

The toolkit is also accompanied by an appendix of documents including published articles, national reports, and case study material on integrated care models for children and young people.

It will be developed, adapted, expanded and improved in collaboration with stakeholders and as experience with strategic commissioning for these new service models develops.


"A new vision for integrating primary care, improving the access, experience and outcomes for our communities, which centres around three essential offers:

- helping people to stay well for longer as part of a more ambitious and joined-up approach to prevention."
