To: Current date

Measures

- **People:** Number of staff attending the training both PAH/Community and evaluation of session
- Engagement of medical staffing (increased attendance)
- Patients and performance: Increase compliance, quality and volume of delirium assessments completed and improvement in patient/carer experience.

Tests for change

Delirium care for patients at PAH and the wider community is much improved Staff feel more confident and prepared to care PAH is recognized nationally as QI in delirium care Improved length of stay, reduction in harm
