Bundles of quick responses (QR)

Project aim

Communicate effectively and improve engagement with 'care bundles' to support efforts to reduce unwarranted variation in care and ultimately improve outcomes for our patients.

Solution identified

To support our efforts to communicate and engage clinical teams with PAHT care bundles the Quality First Team worked in partnership with the Communications Team to upload the care bundles onto the hospital website. Once web links were generated we were able to create quick responses (QR) codes, which enabled medical teams to access the care bundles directly via their smart mobile phones making evidence based best practice much more accessible.

Learning and next steps

We have learnt that have QR codes available for clinical teams to access information is a useful way to engage teams in quality improvement projects and will consider how we use them again in the future.
